RESIDENT PROFILE: Abe Zitren

Every person has a unique story to tell. We each walk our own journey through life and while sometimes our destinations are the same, the paths we take to get there vary greatly. That's often the case for our residents at Lions Gate.

For Abe Zitren, his path crossed several continents, encompassed a World War and two major battles before he and his wife could begin building their lives together.

Ninety-two-year-old Abe, a World War II Veteran, fought in the Battle of the Bulge and other battles across Europe. Like many WWII Veterans, he doesn't talk much about his service, except to say that it had a profound effect on his life. Abe went to war in Europe while engaged to his fiancée– who desperately wanted to get married before his departure. Although he was very much in love, he would not marry her because he did not want to make her a war widow.

Fortunately, Abe survived the war and in 1945 – one week after his return – the two married and would go on to spend nearly 65 happy years together.

Abe earned a degree in accounting from Pace University, but quickly determined he did NOT want to be an accountant. Instead, he began a successful career in commercial real estate, working with well-known national and international companies. For more than 20 years, he managed the Smith Haven Mall, the largest shopping mall on Long Island, NY.

"It was the perfect career for my wife," says Abe. "She was a committed and passionate shopper!"

Abe looks back on his nine-plus decades and acknowledges his good fortunes. "I've been lucky in life," he says. "I loved what I did, I met fascinating people – from politicians to business leaders – and I had a wonderful family."

Abe spent most of his life in northern New Jersey. After his wife passed away five years ago, he continued to live on his own for nearly four years. While still mentally and

physically healthy, he realized the many benefits of moving to a community where he wouldn't have to maintain a house, cook all of his meals, drive or worry about what to do if his health needs changed. So, a year and a half ago, he moved to Lions Gate to be closer to his daughters and grandchildren.

"I appreciate the help we have here, and I take comfort in knowing that healthcare is available if I need it," says Abe. "I especially like being close to my grandchildren!"

"The best way to get to know a community is to get to know the residents," says Cristina Palella, Director of Residential Life at Lions Gate. "While Lions Gate offers people the chance to live out their retirement dreams and aspirations without needing to worry about home maintenance or safety, it's the residents who truly make it a community. **Abe is one of those truly special people who make this community great!**"

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5-Star Community Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services $\star \star \star \star \star \star$

When it comes to quality care, nobody does it better than Lions Gate! The Centers for Medicare

& Medicaid Services (CMS) has awarded a 5-Star Rating – its highest rating – to the Health Center at Lions Gate. This rating reflects excellence in programming, community management, patient care, medical practices, staffing, amenities and patient satisfaction.

Less than half of all nursing homes nationwide receive four stars, and even fewer earn the 5-Star Rating. Here in New Jersey, only 27 percent of nursing homes have a 5-Star Rating. Nationally, as you'll see on the next page, the averages are much, much lower.

"We made a commitment to our residents and to our community to provide the best care and services possible," says Susan Love, Executive Director of Operations at Lions Gate. "The recent 5-Star Rating is the culmination of that commitment. Results like these would not be achieved without the hard work and dedication of the staff at Lions Gate. It is because of them that we received this exceptional rating!"

"The 5-Star Rating for our Health Center reflects our staff's promise to ensure our patients' stays are overwhelmingly positive experiences," adds Lions Gate CEO Mo Funk. "Our goal has always been to return patients to their prior living situations with an improved level of functioning in the most expeditious way possible."

About the 5-Star Quality Rating System

The Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services is a division of the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS). One of its responsibilities is to monitor and rate nursing homes nationwide. CMS created the 5-Star Quality Rating System to help consumers and their families and caregivers compare nursing home options and identify specific areas that they should inquire about when visiting a community.



The Nursing Home Compare website features a quality rating system that gives each nursing home a rating between one and five stars. Nursing homes with five stars are considered to be of premier quality, while nursing homes with one star are considered to be far below average. Here are the national averages:

- 10% in each state receive a 5-Star Rating
- The middle 70% of facilities receive a rating of two, three or four stars, with an equal number in each rating category
- 20% receive the poorest score a 1-Star Rating

CMS' health inspection ratings are based on the relative performance of communities within a state. Here are a few of the measured standards:

Health Inspections – The health inspection rating contains information from the last three years of on-site inspections, including both standard surveys and any complaint surveys.

Staffing – The staffing rating has information about the number of hours of care provided on average to each resident each day by nursing staff.

Quality Measures – The quality measure rating has information on 11 different physical and clinical measures for nursing home residents. More than 12 million assessments of the conditions of nursing home residents are used in the 5-Star Quality Rating System.



Now that we have earned this top-tier status, Lions Gate is determined to keep moving forward and improving our level of care. "We know we must continue meeting needs and exceeding expectations," adds Susan. "And we will."

- Over 30% of older adults have untreated cavities.
- Nearly 25% of adults between the ages of 65 and 74 have periodontal disease, which is linked to diabetes, heart disease, stroke, respiratory disease and pneumonia.
- Only 2% of older Americans have dental insurance.
- Medicaid is not universally available.



Poor oral health can lead to serious health issues in seniors and can severely impact their quality of life. It's a widespread problem for a variety of reasons. Some lose dental benefits when they retire. Many suffer from diseases like arthritis and Alzheimer's, which can make good dental hygiene a challenge. For others, it's something as simple as transportation to and from a dentist.

JSHHS is working toward improving access to quality dental care, with the hope of building a permanent Dental Operatory at Lions Gate. Designed to provide effective, affordable strategies for better general health and an enhanced quality of life, the clinic is expected to serve residents at the Dubin, Gesher and Saltzman Houses.

"Regular preventive care is essential to improving quality of life," says Lions Gate Director of Development Felice Kelem. "Easier access to even the most basic dental care, such as a regular oral exam, can make a big difference in a senior's overall health and self-esteem."

"Understanding the key ingredients for successful aging, each of our communities is rich with activity," says JSHHS Director of Property Management MariAnne Torres. "Each promotes a wellness focus and encourages social interaction. Residents engage with friends, play games, discuss books, learn computer skills, strengthen muscles, improve their balance and entertain their own families in attractive surroundings." From regular exercise classes and arts programs to rehabilitation and housekeeping services to healthy kosher dining and home health care, MariAnne says the lifestyle offered within each community empowers residents to lead more active, healthy lifestyles each day.

"Physical exercise is a strong focus for residents," adds MariAnne. "On a recurring schedule, Fox Rehabilitation[™] conducts physically engaging, ageappropriate programs and classes that inspire residents to live well and be well. Programs focus on overall wellness – strengthening the mind and body – as a consistent means to longevity and quality of life." Those residents in need of short-term subacute care or inpatient short-term rehabilitation may receive it at Lions Gate. Fox Rehabilitation provides rehabilitation services at Lions Gate, and if necessary, can continue these at home once a resident is discharged.
