From public school to private practice, Jackie worked with everyone from autistic children to adults with Down's Syndrome, and would often incorporate art into her sessions as a way to connect with patients. "I used to love to do illustrations on the board for my elementary students," said Jackie. "It never failed to grab their attention."

Jackie later got married, and had two children. Her daughter, Johanna, now lives in Pennsylvania, and her son, John, currently lives in Toronto. "I took a short break in my career to raise my children," said Jackie, "but I never took a break from making art. During the '70's I taught art to elementary-aged children in an after school program. We would do everything from printmaking with a mushroom to loomweaving. It was tremendous fun!"

Jackie retired from her private practice in speech pathology shortly after moving to Lions Gate. "There is so much to do here, that

I felt like I was missing too much if I didn't truly invest myself in the day-to-day activities at Lions Gate. Work was just getting in the way," smiled Jackie. "And the first thing I really wanted to immerse myself in was art. The teachers here are wonderful."

Jackie is planning to share her figure drawings, floral still lifes, and landscapes as part of her personal art show. "I work in both pastels and watercolors these days," said Jackie. Introducing the new Chef: Shannon Johnson

Executive Chef, Shannon Johnson, Brings the YUM to Every Lions Gate Meal!

Have you ever imagined what you would do if you were on the cooking show "Chopped"? Could you take a basket of random ingredients, and whip up an amazing restaurant-level dish?

That's exactly how Executive Chef, Shannon Johnson, started her career at Lions Gate.

"When you apply for any culinary position at Lions Gate," said Shannon, "it is a two-part process. First you do an indepth interview, and if they like you, you are called back for a cook test. In a cook test, you are presented with a basket of ingredients, and you have to come up with the most delicious meal you can imagine, all while adhering to kosher law."

And what did Shannon come up with in her Chopped challenge that launched her career at Lions Gate? "Chicken Teriyaki, fried rice, and grilled asparagus," giggled Shannon. "I was so nervous, and I had no idea where any of the pots and pans were in this enormous kitchen. Instead of speaking up and asking where the cookware was, I just grilled everything. It actually gave my dishes a super fresh flavor profile that I was really happy with. And I guess grilling wasn't the approach many aspiring cooks took in their test, so that set me apart."

Shannon continues to set herself apart in every way at Lions Gate. In just 4-1/2 years, she has vaulted through the ranks in the Lions Gate kitchen, moving from Cook to Baker to Lead Cook to Chef Manager to Executive Chef. "When I first arrived at Lions Gate to interview for a job, I almost turned around and walked out," said Shannon. "It is so beautiful here. I thought I was completely out of my league. But I just took a deep breath, and let my food speak for itself. I landed the job, so I guess my food had lot to say."

The position of Executive Chef at Lions Gate involves so much more than menu planning, ordering, budgeting, and supervising an extensive staff. "There is an enormous learning curve involved in keeping a kosher kitchen," said Shannon. "It is my responsibility to make sure my entire staff follows kosher law. I work closely with the Mashgiach who supervises the Kashrut status of kosher establishments as well as to the Rabbi who comes in annually to evaluate both my staff and the Mashgiach."



Shannon's kitchen is a hub

of creativity inspired by the beauty of multigenerational friendships. "I just love the people at Lions Gate," said Shannon. "I love their stories, and I love their feedback. It is my pleasure to take their favorite recipes, and modernize them with a little twist of my own. I absolutely love the matzah ball soup we serve here, and our Jewish apple cake is second to none."

Shannon originally went to West Chester University to become a dietician, and started cooking professionally just to help pay her tuition bills. After she earned her degree, she just couldn't bring herself to leave the kitchen. And that seems to be the same story for her 3-year old daughter, Avery. "Avery is my heart," smiled Shannon. "She is always in the kitchen with me. She loves to wear her hat and apron when we cook together, and she's always asking me to make cakes. She's only 3, but she can already crack an egg, and slice fruit. I have a feeling we'll be seeing her on 'Chopped Junior' someday soon!"

BookMates is an interfaith literacy program that provides services to Title 1 elementary schools in low and moderate income communities throughout South Jersey. Older adults volunteer for one-on-one reading sessions with almost 600 students in kindergarten through second grade. Usually the adult volunteers go to the students, but once a year the BookMates students come to the residents at Lions Gate. This year the students arrived from Molina Elementary School in Camden, NJ.
