Dear Lions Gate Community Members,

In follow-up to my letter to you dated April 10, 2020, we appreciate all of the positive feedback we have received from residents and families within our Lions Gate community. However, one item that was not included in the letter, but was requested in your responses, is the information regarding the number of positive COVIDI-19 cases at Lions Gate. Therefore, the results, which are cumulative since March, are provided below:

- Number of residents who have tested positive for COVID-19 = 33
- Number of positive test results: Skilled Nursing/Rehab = 31
- Number of positive test results: Assisted Living = 1, Independent Living = 1
- Number of Persons Under Investigation (PUI) Residents = 0
- Number of COVID-19 Positive Resident Deaths = 6
- Number of Employees who have tested positive for COVID-19 = 13
- Number of Employees who are Persons Under Investigation(PUI) = 0

Below are some FAQ (frequently asked questions) about how Lions Gate is protecting our residents and staff:

1. HOW IS STAFF PROTECTED?

As mandated by the State of NJ for all communities, ALL EMPLOYEES MUST wear masks at ALL TIMES. Temperature taking and symptom assessment for ALL staff will continue upon entering the employee entrance door.

2. WILL STAFF AND RESIDENTS BE TESTED?

Only residents and employees who are showing symptoms (fever, dry cough, and shortness of breath) will be tested for COVID-19 as per the Department of Health and CDC guidelines. Due to the number of residents in skilled nursing who have tested positive, we are in the process of testing all residents on the first floor of skilled nursing.

3. ARE RESIDENTS QUARANTINED?

Lions Gate has designated the 2nd floor of Skilled Nursing as a closed unit for residents who are positive for COVID-19. The dedicated staff caring for these residents wear N95 masks, face shields, gowns, and gloves at all times.

We will continue to provide you with updates as they become available. Please know that we are strictly adhering to all directions from the CDC, state and local health department.

We thank you for your continued cooperation and support and appreciate your partnership on this journey.
